The meeting's worship planning team wanted a hymn that expounded the Luke 4:16-20 text in a way that was inclusive, raised one's spirits even in difficult situations, and was familiar enough to be sung with enthusiasm when first heard. They were unsuccessful in their search, and Huber, sensing the tune "Truro" to be a perfect vehicle for the words "live into hope," sat down and wrote her first hymn. With it, she embarked on the vocation of hymn writing.

National Organ Donor Sabbath Is Today

More than 60,000 Americans are waiting for organ transplants, and hundreds of thousands more could benefit from tissue transplants. On this day set aside to focus on the importance of making a commitment to share life, stop by the advocacy table in Anderson Hall during Coffee Hour to pick up informational brochures and donor cards.
