During Today's Worship



IN THE DETAILS



The Great East Window in the Fourth Presbyterian Church sanctuary was designed by Charles J. Connick with the stone tracery intended to be reminiscent of the traditional “Jesse tree.” With the vine, leaves, and grapes providing a background for the large figures, this window, known as the Nettie Fowler McCormick Memorial Window, is similar to Connick’s east window in the Princeton University Chapel.

Shown on this page is the second window panel from the left, in which Peter stands with book and keys. Below him in the window (*upper right*) is a representation of the New Testament parable of the sower (Mark 4:1–20), and below that is a depiction of the Old Testament allegory of the vineyard and tower on a fruitful hill (Isaiah 5).

Fourth Church welcomes to its pulpit this morning Cynthia Campbell, a longtime friend of Fourth Church and frequent guest preacher and instructor in the Academy for Faith and Life. Dr. Campbell is Professor of Church and Ministry in addition to serving as the ninth president of McCormick Theological Seminary. She began her ministry in Dallas, Texas, and served as Associate Professor of Theology and Ministry at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. In 1988, she became pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Salina, Kansas, one of the first large congregations in the denomination to call a woman as head of staff. She has also served on a wide variety of task forces and committees within the PCUSA.

Today's Minute for Mission is being presented by Stacy Jackson, Director of Tutoring and Scholarship, on behalf of Chicago Lights at Fourth Presbyterian Church.
