We are deeply grateful to all who participated in “Meeting the Challenge” and the 2009 Annual Appeal for Chicago Lights and Fourth Church. To date, we have received \$4,793,979, from 1,531 households, toward our \$5.1 million goal, including \$411,500 in response to the challenge effort.

Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles.
