

On May 21, 1914, just two weeks after the dedication of its new sanctuary, Fourth Presbyterian Church hosted the 126th annual General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. The gathering's opening communion service welcomed 1,822 people, which included the 865 commissioners and their guests.

Of the commissioners in attendance, 778 gathered for a panoramic photograph on Delaware Place outside the new church. A detail from that photo shows the outgoing Moderator of the 125th General Assembly, Fourth Church Pastor John Timothy Stone (at center, wearing a light-colored suit, with his hat on his lap).

This coming Saturday, the 219th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) will begin in Minneapolis. John Buchanan, who was Moderator of the 208th General Assembly (1996), and others from Fourth Church will also be in attendance.
