#### **News and Resources**

The main entrance to the church buildings and the reception desk will be relocated beginning Monday, January 10. The 126 E. Chestnut entrance will no longer be accessible to the public after today. The main entrance during the construction period will be through the southeast corner of the Garth, and the new reception desk will be at that entrance, where the Large Conference Room has been.

Some of the church staff and some programming spaces are relocating this week to the 19th floor of the 737 building (Olympia Centre), which is located on Chicago Avenue, just east of Michigan Avenue (behind Walgreens), during the construction period.

Center for Life and Learning classes and offices will relocate to the 737 building beginning Tuesday, January 11.
