



**The Chancel and Morning Choirs** are being commissioned during the 8:00 and 11:00 services respectively. **Today's prayers are from** a Presbyterian Church (USA) worship resource for observing the tenth anniversary of 9/11.

**This morning's anthem, "Shalom, Peace, Salaam,"** begins with one note and gradually expands to many notes as each individual singer adds lines of music at his or her own pace. At the conclusion, the singers return to the same note that began the piece. It uses words for peace that are familiar to the Jewish, Christian, and Islamic faiths.

**This morning, Communion is served by intinction.** The congregation will come forward by the center aisle to receive the bread, which they will then dip into the chalice of grape juice. (Gluten-free bread is available in a small tumbler in each basket of bread.) Worshipers will return to their pews by the side aisles. All who confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper.
