

Each time capsule is a 16x12x7-inch heavy-gauge stainless-steel box. The boxes have been tightly sealed closed and will be “bricked in” behind the cornerstone on Delaware Place. All printed and digital materials in the time capsules have been prepared and packaged for maximum longevity. However, because the long-term viability of 2012-generated printed materials and electronic media cannot be known, all materials in the time capsules have been multiply archived and backed up (in various digital formats as well as in printed form when applicable) in multiple locations outside the time capsules.
