



The associate architect of the Michigan Avenue property, Howard Van Doren Shaw, donated the courtyard "Children's Fountain" in 1913. The base is decorated with depictions of various animals, while the four sides of the top include the verse "For the earth shall be / filled with the knowledge / of the glory of the Lord / as the waters cover the sea" (Isaiah 11:9; Habbakuk 2:14).
