If there is one thing that we have all been taught to fear, it is surely questions. There are some things, we learn early, that are never to be challenged. They simply are. They are absolute. They come out of a fountain of eternal truth. And they are true because someone else said they are true. So we live with someone else's truth for a long time. Until the answers run dry. I know that because I myself have been caught in a desert of doubt and found the answers to be worse than the questions ever could be. . . . I began to trust the questions themselves to lead me beyond understanding, to faith. I began to use my questions themselves to chart my way through the dark waters.



Baptism at Fourth Presbyterian Church

"Let the little children come to me . . . for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." Matthew 19:14 (NRSV)

On the second Sunday of each month, Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in morning worship. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ.
