The beginning of the prelude is a call to silent, personal preparation for the worship of God.

When we could have looked ahead, we fell behind. When we could have viewed the wider picture, we saw only a part. When we could have sensed the Spirit leading, we missed the way. Forgive our dim apprehension of love's clear leading. Give us faith that trusts when it cannot see, and illumine us by your Word and Sacrament,

that we might follow your paths once more. Amen.


