

- We will be offering two in-person worship services, beginning next Sunday, June 20 as we gradually reopen our campus this summer. These will be a 10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary and 4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel.
- Those who would like to worship in person will be asked to **preregister online**, as there will be limited seating for both services (250 in the morning in the Sanctuary; 65 in the afternoon in the Chapel) as well as self-certification requirements.
- **The registration link for in-person worship** will be **posted on Sundays at 5:30 p.m.** (beginning today) **on the Fourth Church website:** www.fourthchurch.org (*if you do not see the link on Sunday evening, try refreshing your web browser*).
- **For visitors and those without a way to access technology,** a limited number of seats will be available for on-site registration on the day of the service. Those individuals will need to register at the door, in order to provide name and contact information as well as complete the necessary self-certification.
- Anyone who can preregister online will find doing so to be the **fastest and easiest way to** reserve a seat.
- The reservation system **allots the number of seats but not particular locations.** On the day of worship, specific locations will be assigned by ushers, based on household size and the order in which people are seated.
- The reservation system will process registrations on a **first-come**, **first-served basis**. While there is **no wait list** for seats, spaces will open up if people cancel their reservations. If there are no seats available when you try to make a reservation, you might **check back periodically** to see if any have opened up.
- **Staff does not have the capacity to make reservations on behalf of individuals.** All registrations will need to be made by individuals or families preregistering themselves online or at the door prior to the worship service.
- **Confirmation of reservations** will be sent by email or text. **If confirmation is not received,** the reservation is not complete and the name will not appear on the list of those with reservations for worship.
- Individuals who find their plans change after making reservations are asked to **cancel any reservation they will not be using** so that space opens up for others.

For those who will be joining us in person next week:

Masks will be required at all times for all present in the building, regardless of vaccination status.

Social distancing of 6 feet between individuals and those not in their household will also be required at all times.

Seating will be by households only, and ushers will direct worshipers to and from specific seating to ensure the maintenance of social distancing.

Doors will open a half hour before the service, and there will be no seating after the service begins.

Access will be by Michigan Avenue doors only for the morning service and by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center only for the Jazz at Four service.

Nursery care and child care will not be available; Sunday School will continue to be held online.

There will be **no congregational singing**, though humming is permitted.

There will be **no in-person Coffee Hour**; it will continue to be held online via Zoom immediately following the morning service.

We are **not checking vaccination status**, but by **coming on site you will certify** that you do not currently have COVID-19, are not experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, and have no reason to quarantine.

We will continue to **stream worship** for those who prefer to worship online or are unable to join us in person. We currently stream our online-only service at 11:00 a.m. at **www.bit.ly**/ **FPCworship**, **Facebook Live** (facebook.com/fourthchurch), and **YouTube** (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos).

(That **stream time will change to 10:00 a.m. on June 20**, and the services will continue to be available for viewing immediately afterward for those who prefer to watch around 11:00, in the afternoon, or another day.) * Those without Internet access are invited to **listen to the service via phone by calling 888.916.9166** at the time of the service. * During the week we make the service and sermon available via **podcast on iTunes and Spotify** (www.bit.ly/FPCpodcast).
