# Spoken Word



\*Please rise in body or spirit.

- O all ye who travel upon the highway, hearken to me, and behold me; was e'er sorrow like unto my sorrow? For the Lord almighty hath dealt bitterly with me. Call me now no more Naomi, from today call me Mara.
- **First Word ::** *"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And the people clamored, "He is death guilty, take him, let us crucify him. Be his blood on us and on our children." Then they did crucify Jesus, and the two thieves, one at his right hand, the other at his left hand.*
- **Second Word** "*""Today, thou shalt be with me in paradise. Amen, so I tell thee." Hear me, O Lord, and remember me, when thou comest into thy kingdom.*
- Third Word " "See, O woman, here behold thy beloved Son." See the mother, bowed in anguish, who beside the cross doth languish, where on high her Son is borne; is there mortal, who not feeleth to behold her where she kneeleth, so woeful and all forlorn?
- Fourth Word " "God, my Father, why hast thou forsaken me?" All those who were my friends, all have now forsaken me; and they that hate me do now prevail against me, and he whom I have cherished hath betrayed me. Even the vine that I have chosen, and that I have planted; wherefore art thou now so strangely turned into bitterness that I by thee am crucified?
- Fifth Word " "I am athirst." And the men then passing by him, all did rail upon him, and wagging their heads at him, they said unto him, "Ah, thou wouldst fain destroy the temple; if thou be Jesus, Son of the Father, now descend from the cross, that we behold it, and believe on thee when we behold it. If thou art king over Israel, save thyself then!
- Sixth Word " "Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit." For thou art my God and Father, thou art my Savior. Into thy hands I commit my spirit.
- Seventh Word " And with a loud voice Jesus cried, "It is finished." And he did bow his head and rendered up his spirit. And it was about the sixth hour, and the sun was darkened, and darkness covered the earth until about the ninth hour; and the veil of the temple was rent, and all the earth did quake, the rocks were rent, and all the graves were opened wide.
- **Prayer** "*Christ, we do all adore thee and we do praise thee forever, for on the holy cross hast thou the world redeemed from sin.*

*Leader:* O crucified Jesus, holy temple of God, dwelling place of the Most High, gate of heaven, burning flame of love,

#### People: we worship you.

Leader: O crucified Jesus, sanctuary of justice and love, full of kindness, source of all faithfulness,

#### People: we worship you.

Leader: O crucified Jesus, ruler of every heart, in you are all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge, in you dwells all the fullness of the Godhead,

People: we worship you.

Leader: Jesus, Lamb of God,

People: have mercy on us.

Leader: Jesus, bearer of our sins,

People: have mercy on us.

Leader: Jesus, redeemer of the world,

#### People: grant us peace.

Leader: Almighty God, look with mercy on your family for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed and to be given over to the hands of sinners and to suffer death on the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen

When I survey the wondrous cross on which the Prince of glory died, my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride.

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast, save in the death of Christ my God; all the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to his blood.

See, from his head, his hands, his feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down; did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?

Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were a present far too small; love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all.

#### A NOTE ON HOLY WEEK AND ANTI-SEMITISM

The Passion texts can pose problems for Christian-Jewish relations. For centuries, many Christians blamed "The Jews" for Christ's death. This interpretation is incorrect, misguided, and dangerous. In fact, crucifixion was solely a Roman form of punishment, one used to frighten subjugated peoples into obeying Roman authority. Tragically, Christians have misused the reading of the Passion to foment violent anti-Semitic pogroms. Anti-Semitism still plagues the world. We read these texts with sensitivity and caution, remembering the cruelties and failures of our past.

Thus we not only encourage the wearing of masks by anyone who wants or needs to wear one, but we are also committed to ensuring no one will feel out of place should they choose to wear a mask while at the church. **\*\*** Since some populations are more vulnerable to COVID-19 than others, some programs on our campus may still choose to require masks. \* Additionally, we are continuing our practice of not checking vaccination status, but anyone coming on site certifies by doing so that (a) they do not currently have COVID-19; (b) they are not experiencing COVID symptoms; (c) they have no reason to quarantine; and (d) they will wear a mask and practice social distancing if they are not vaccinated against COVID-19. **\*** We are **singing during worship.** We invite those who are concerned about others singing unmasked to either worship with us, masked, in the socially distanced seating section or join us in worshiping online. **\*\*** In the Sanctuary, the front section on the pulpit side is for those required to or choosing to practice social distancing, and everyone sitting in that section is required to wear a mask. The remainder of the Sanctuary is open seating. (Please note, however, that there will not be a socially distanced section on Easter Sunday.)



**Worship can be heard** in the Sanctuary through the "T" or "T-coil" setting of hearing aids. **\*** Please silence **electronic devices** when in the Sanctuary. **\* Nursery care** is not available at this time.

Entrance for the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Easter services will be only through the glass Loggia doors on Michigan Avenue, next to the courtyard. Seating will begin a half hour prior to each of those two services. **\*\*** There will be no socially distanced seating at any of the Easter services. We invite those who prefer to practice social distancing to join us in worship outdoors for the sunrise service or online for the 11:00 a.m. service. **\*\*** An Easter program for children will be held in the Gratz Center at 9:00 a.m. on Easter; nursery care will not be available.
