If you would like to join us for in-person worship, we gather on Sundays for a 10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary and the 4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel. \* Worship can be heard through hearing aids' "T" or "T-coil" setting. \* Please silence electronic devices when in the Chapel. \* The doors open for worship on Sundays a half hour before each service. For the 4:00 service, access is only by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center. \* Sunday parking is available at 900 N. Michigan (access from Rush or Walton) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (and \$18 for up to 12 hours). Validation tickets for the garage must be picked up from an usher. \* For those who prefer to worship online or are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning service on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos).
