We are glad to be worshiping with you today and invite you to continue to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice. ** Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation!

Joining us online

Each Sunday our worshiping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. For those who prefer to worship online or who are unable to join us in person, we **livestream our 9:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. services** on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos), where they can be viewed any time after the services begin. (For tips on how to watch—from the beginning—a service that is already in progress, see fourthchurch.org/watch-from-the-beginning) ** Those without Internet access are invited to listen via phone by calling 888.916.9166 at 9:30 a.m.

Joining us in person

If you like to join us for in-person worship, we typically gather at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. However, please note that we will have **only one morning service on Sundays, December 24 and 31, and it will be at 10:00 a.m.** (and also livestreamed). After today, the **Gathering will take a break, resuming on Sunday, January 7.** **On Sundays the **doors open** for worship a half hour prior to each service. There are three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue (through the glass Loggia doors between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors); at 126 E. Chestnut; and at 115 E. Delaware. ** **Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (access from Rush or Walton) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours (and \$18 for up to 12 hours) and at the Hancock garage (875 N. Michigan, enter from Delaware or Chestnut) at the rate of \$10 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from an usher. ** **Worship can be heard** through "T" or "T-coil" settings of hearing aids. ** Please silence electronic devices during worship.

Christmas Eve

On the morning of Sunday, December 24 we will have just one worship service: at 10:00 a.m. That service will also be livestreamed. ** That afternoon and evening we will gather for four candlelight Christmas Eve services: the Christmas Eve Children's Pageant at 4:00 p.m.; Family Service at 6:00 p.m., and Lessons and Carols at 8:00 p.m. (also livestreamed) and 10:00 p.m. ** For services on Christmas Eve, entry will be through the glass Loggia doors next to the courtyard on Michigan Avenue. Seating will begin at 3:15 p.m. for the Pageant; seating for the other three services will begin forty-five to thirty minutes prior to the start of the service. ** Discounted parking on the evening of Christmas Eve will be available at the 900 N. Michigan garage only, at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours (and \$18 for up to 12 hours).

Christmas Day

On **Christmas morning** we will gather again at 10:00 a.m. (*in person only*). ****** For those looking for an online option on Christmas Day, we invite you to view the Christmas Eve service from the evening before or any of our past offerings available on YouTube (*www.bit.ly/fpcvideos*). We will also be sharing there a brief **Christmas "Rhythm and Word" video** time of scripture, music, and reflection that morning. **** Christmas Day parking** validations for the 900 N. Michigan garage (*only*) will available for \$20 and can be purchased in the Commons that morning prior to returning to the garage.

New Year's Eve

On **Sunday, December 31,** we will have **just one morning worship service, at 10:00 a.m.** (also livestreamed). We will then gather in our Sanctuary with neighbors and our friends from Holy Name Cathedral at 6:30 p.m. for a candlelit **New Year's Eve Taizé service** (in person only). (The 2:00 p.m. service will not be held on New Year's Eve or Christmas Eve but will resume on January 7. Our schedule of two morning worship services will resume on January 7 as well.)
