
*Call to Worship

About Today's Sermon

Ancient and contemporary concerns unite, as the topic of political succession is the focus of our passage this morning from 1 Kings. Solomon prepares to ascend the throne after the iconic reign of his father, King David. Speaking to Solomon in a dream, the Lord issues him a pivotal task: "Ask what I should give you."

Solomon's uncommon request may surprise you (it even surprised God!).

How would you respond?
