Each Sunday our worshiping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. If you like to worship with us in person, we gather at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

## **Entering the building**

A half hour prior to each Sunday service the doors open for worship, with three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors (between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors) as well as at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and 115 E. Delaware.

Sherer serving as the congregation's Organist and Director of Music. This second movement of the sonata translates into musical ideas the inscription of "Holy, Holy, Holy" found on the canvases between the Sanctuary's ceiling arches, painted by Frederic C. Bartlett in 1913–1914.
