About the Advent Sermons

During these Advent weeks we will visit each Gospel writer at their home. It will require some imagination, but reading what they have left us, we can learn more than we might first suspect. We will start by celebrating Christmas with Mark. When we arrive, we will have to let Mark know it's Christmas, because Mark knows nothing about it. But he will still have an important word for us about Christmas.

You belong here!

Worshiping in Person at Fourth Church

Each Sunday our worshiping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. If you like to worship with us in person, we gather at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

Entering the building

A half hour prior to each Sunday service the doors open for worship, with three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors (between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors) as well as at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and at 115 E. Delaware.
