

Worshiping with Fourth Church

Each Sunday we gather to worship in person at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and livestream the 9:30 a.m. service at bit.ly/fpcvideos (*On Sunday, December 29 we will worship at 10:00 a.m. only.*)

Entering the building

A half hour prior to each service the doors open for worship, with three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors *(between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors)* as well as at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and at 115 E. Delaware.

Parking
