Christmas Eve

This evening our candlelight Christmas Eve celebrations will continue with our **Lessons and Carols** services at 8:00 p.m. (which will be livestreamed) and at 10:00 p.m. ** **Discounted parking** tonight is only available at the 900 N. Michigan garage, at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours (and \$18 for up to 12 hours) for cars entering the garage after 5:00 p.m. and when using a green validation ticket picked up from one of the ushers when exiting the Sanctuary. ** There is **no nursery care** on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. As on Sundays, children are invited to be with their parents in worship.
