Worshiping in Person at Fourth Church

Each Sunday our worshiping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. If you like to worship with us in person, we gather weekly at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

Entering the building

A half hour prior to each service the doors open for worship, with three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors (*between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors*), as well as at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and at 115 E. Delaware.

Sunday parking is available at 900 N. Michigan (*access from Rush or Walton*) at the rate of \$10 for 6 hours (*and \$20 for up to 12 hours*) and at the Hancock garage (*875 N. Michigan, enter from Delaware or Chestnut*) for \$10 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from ushers.

Congregational Meeting Today

Session has called a Congregational Meeting for today, January 12 at 12:15 p.m. in the Sanctuary and via Zoom (bit.ly/fpcmeeting202501).

At the meeting you will be asked to recommend that the Presbytery of Chicago dissolve Nanette Sawyer’s pastoral relationship with us, as the position of Associate Pastor for Discipleship and Small Group Ministry has been eliminated as part of the staff reductions made by Session and Trustees to help Fourth Church move toward a balanced budget.

For those Fourth Church members attending via Zoom—bit.ly/fpcmeeting202501 (the link is also on the home page of our website)—there will be **one online vote per Zoom login**. Thus if you are accustomed to viewing Zoom as a couple on one device, in this case each person will need to view the meeting on a separate device in order to each cast a vote.
