Worshiping in Person at Fourth Church

A half hour prior to each service the doors open for worship, with three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors (between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors), as well as at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and at 115 E. Delaware.
