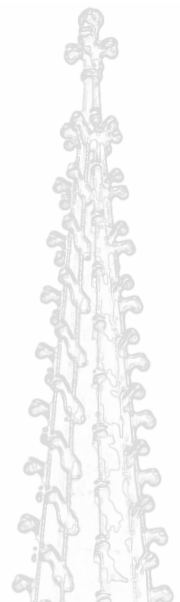

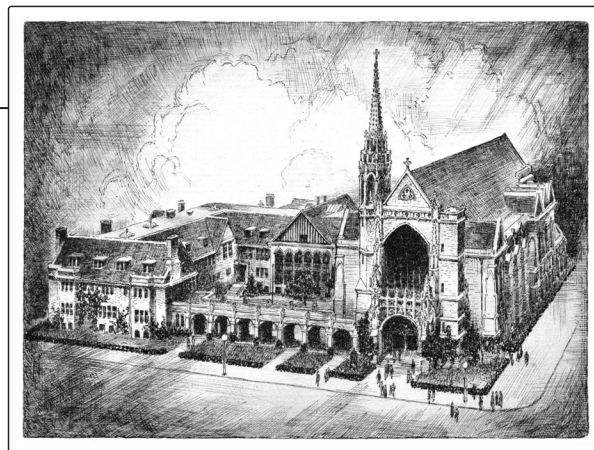

Sustainability

A Note from the Board of Trustees

At the Annual Congregational Meeting next Sunday, February 8, members will receive Fourth Church's 2025 financial results. Presented by the Treasurer, the report was prepared on behalf of the Board of Trustees and reflects the collaborative work of church staff and volunteer leaders.

The Board of Trustees serves as the congregation's legal and corporate representative and, along with the Session, provides fiduciary oversight of finances, operations, property, and legal matters in support of the church's mission. This work is supported by staff and volunteer leaders and is designed to promote thoughtful planning and accountability.

With an annual budget of nearly \$12 million, day-to-day financial operations are led by the Executive Director of Operational Ministries and the accounting team. They are supported by a nationally recognized nonprofit accounting firm for financial reporting. Trustees meet regularly to review results and provide oversight.

We are grateful for the many volunteers who serve behind the scenes and welcome members with relevant skills who feel called to participate in this important ministry.
