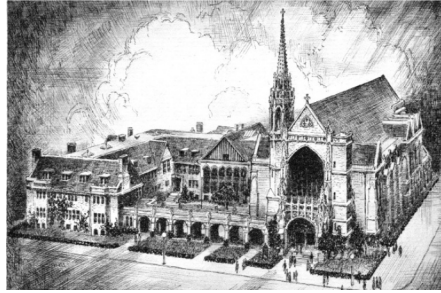
YOU BELONG HERE
