Church Facilities for Our Ministries

At Fourth Church, the Board of Trustees is committed to ensuring that our financial resources sustain the ministries that serve our congregation and community. This month, we highlight our investment in Church Facilities—the people, services, and materials that keep our campus operating smoothly.

Our campus is active seven days a week for worship, faith formation, fellowship, and community service. Keeping the Sanctuary, Parish House, Gratz Center, and grounds safe, welcoming, and in good working order requires heat, electricity, communications and online services, House Staff, maintenance, security, insurance, permits, and more.

In 2026, Fourth Church has budgeted \$2,268,000 for Church Facilities. Individual giving supports 54% of these expenses, 38% comes from invested funds, and 8% from activity fees and designated gifts.

Your generosity helps keep our campus welcoming, safe, and ready to serve. Thank you for partnering in this shared ministry.

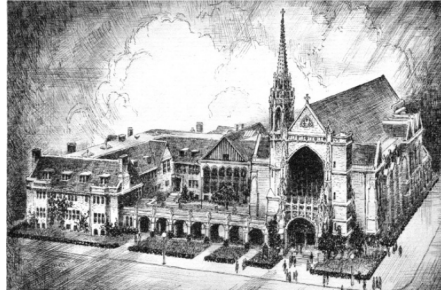
YOU BELONG HERE
