



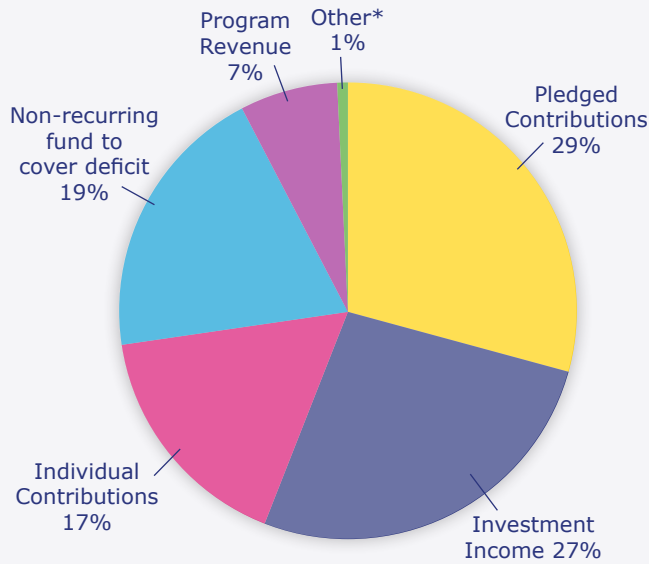

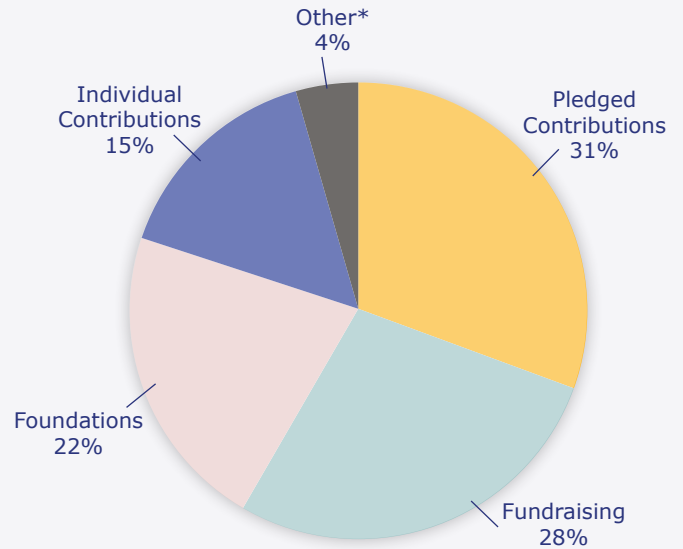

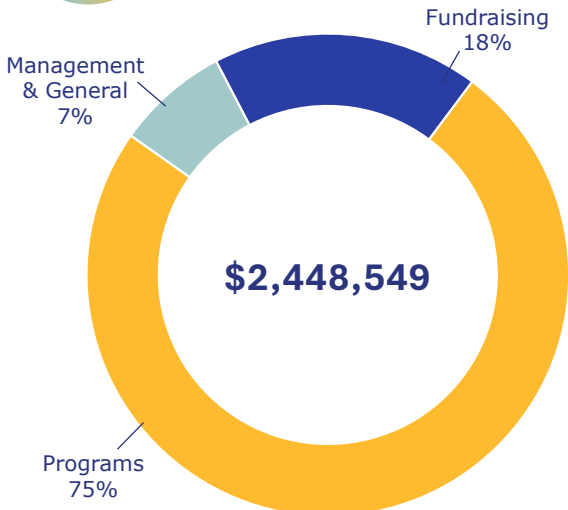
EDUCATION & DISCIPLESHIP

CHICAGO LIGHTS – the church's community outreach nonprofit is one of the ways that Fourth Church lives out its call to be a light in the city, offering hope and opportunity to our city's children, youth, and adults through diverse programs.



OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Tutoring pairs 300+ students with caring volunteer mentors to foster students' academic and personal growth.

Summer Day reduces learning loss and engages 100+ students in academic, arts, and enrichment programming.

Urban Farm helps students and young adults gain on-site job skills through urban farming - setting them up for success as they pursue fulfilling careers.

Elam Davies Social Service Center helps adults pursue and reach their goals toward achieving greater stability by providing food, clothing, housing, and other resources to help build healthy and fulfilling lives.

Chicago Lights is a separate 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with a separate budget. Fourth Church supports Chicago Lights through shared volunteers, donors, and the in-kind provision of professional services, resources, and space in the Gratz Center.
