As part of our observance of Reformation Sunday, a bagpiper plays the recessional at the close of morning worship, reminding us of the Scottish roots of the Presbyterian church.

November 7 is All Saints' Sunday, a day when we remember the faithful who have gone before us and honor departed loved ones. As part of that observance, the names of all Fourth Church members who have entered the Church Triumphant in 2004 will be read during morning worship. During evening worship, the Morning Choir will sing *Requiem* by Gabriel Fauré.
