THANKSGIVING

Join us at 12:15 p.m. today for the Dedication of the Gratz Center and Buchanan Chapel

Access to the Gratz Center for the dedication will be through Anderson Hall only and will begin *after* the 11:00 service ends.

The dedication will take place in two parts, first in the Gignilliat Commons and then in Buchanan Chapel. Only the worship leaders will move between those two spaces between Parts I and II of the dedication. All others are invited to watch the dedication from:

- The Sanctuary, with plenty of seating and a live video feed of the entire dedication
- **Gignilliat Commons**, where there will be standing only (no seating), with live video feed from the Buchanan Chapel portion (Part II) of the dedication
- **Buchanan Chapel** on the second floor (access via Gratz Center elevator-corridor stairwell), where seats for an additional 275 participants will be available, with video feed of the Gratz Center portion (Part I) of the dedication
- **Bumpus Activity Room** on the second floor (access via Gratz Center elevator-corridor stairwell), where there will be seating and a live video feed of the entire dedication
- **Room 4G** on the fourth floor of the Gratz Center (access via Gratz Center elevators), with live video feed of the entire dedication

Nursery care is available in the Page Smith Room in Parish House until 2:30 p.m. today. Refreshments and opportunity to become familiar with the Gratz Center will be available after the forty-five-minute dedication service.
