World Communion Sunday

On this World Communion Sunday, worshipers around the world gather for the Lord's Supper, enacting the words of the hymn "Come, Risen Lord": "One church united in communion blest; one name we bear, one bread of life we break."

As part of our observance, this morning we will hear the words of the Communion liturgy spoken in multiple languages. We also have on the Communion table a colorful cloth and communionware—given to Fourth Church on our visits to Ghana and Cuba respectively—and a variety of traditional breads representing countries and cultures around the world.

Celebrating the Lord's Supper

As we join in celebrating the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, the invitation to the table is not just for Presbyterians or "members of the church." Even those who doubt or whose trust is wavering are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper, in which we are assured of God's love and grace.

Those who are worshiping with us from home are encouraged to have bread and juice on hand so that we might share in this meal together, wherever we are.

This Sunday reminds us that God's love can heal our deepest divisions, and so each World Communion Sunday we receive a Peacemaking and Global Witness Offering.
