Congregational Meeting Today

Session has called a Congregational Meeting for today, January 12 at 12:15 p.m. in the Sanctuary and via Zoom (bit.ly/fpcmeeting202501).

At the meeting you will be asked to recommend that the Presbytery of Chicago dissolve Nanette Sawyer's pastoral relationship with us, as the position of Associate Pastor for Discipleship and Small Group Ministry has been eliminated as part of the staff reductions made by Session and Trustees to help Fourth Church move toward a balanced budget.
