Worshiping in Person at Fourth Church

Each Sunday our worshiping body is a wonderful mix of those online, on the phone, and in the pews. If you like to worship with us in person, we gather weekly at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. (except on Easter Sunday, when the second service starts at 11:30 a.m.)

Entering the building

A half hour prior to each service the doors open for worship. There is an entrance without steps leading to the Sanctuary on Michigan Avenue, through the glass Loggia doors (next to the courtyard). There are also two fully accessible entrances: at 126 E. Chestnut—where the reception desk is located—and at 115 E. Delaware.

Sound

- Worship can be heard through "T" or "T-coil" settings of hearing aids.
- Please silence electronic devices during worship.

Parking

Sunday parking is available at 900 N. Michigan (access from Rush or Walton) at the rate of \$10 for 6 hours (and \$20 for up to 12 hours) and at the Hancock garage (875 N. Michigan, enter from Delaware or Chestnut) for \$10 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from ushers.

Holy Week Worship Services

Maundy Thursday

On April 17, Maundy Thursday, we will gather in the Sanctuary at 6:30 p.m. for our annual Tenebrae service, with Communion.

This evening service, which will also be livestreamed, follows the ancient Office of Tenebrae (from the Latin for "shadows"). The service portrays the progression from light to darkness in the passion of Jesus, beginning with his abandonment on Thursday and concluding with his crucifixion. The service ends with the Sanctuary in complete darkness.

Good Friday

On April 18 we will observe Good Friday with

- 12:10 p.m. Good Friday service
- 5:30 p.m. program for children and families
- 6:30 p.m. Good Friday Choral Service

The 12:10 and 6:30 p.m. services will be held in the Sanctuary; the children's program will take place in Buchanan Chapel.

The Choral Service, which will also be livestreamed, will feature the Morning and Chancel Choirs—with members of the Civic Orchestra of Chicago—presenting Franz Josef Haydn's *Stabat Mater*. The service ends with the bells tolling thirty-three times, once for each year of Jesus' life on earth.

Easter Sunday

On Easter Sunday we will gather for three services:

- 6:30 a.m. Sunrise Service at Oak Street Beach,
- 9:30 a.m. Easter service in the Sanctuary
- 11:30 a.m. Easter service in the Sanctuary Seating in the Sanctuary will begin a half hour prior to each of those two services.

The 9:30 a.m. service will be livestreamed, with the prelude beginning around 9:15 a.m., and will be available to watch anytime later that morning or afterwards. Those without Internet access can listen to the 9:30 service via phone by dialing 888.916.9166 between 9:15 and 9:30 a.m.

Nursery care will be available between 9:00 a.m. and 12:45 p.m.

An Easter program for children will be held in the Gratz Center at 9:30 a.m. on Easter Sunday.
