Worshiping in Person at Fourth Church

New Zoom Book Group Begins Thursday

The featured book will be *A Circle of Quiet* by Madeleine L'Engle, a reflective memoir blending personal history, spiritual exploration, and meditations on writing, science, and faith.

Through intimate essays, L'Engle considers how creativity, doubt, and belief intertwine, emphasizing the value of stillness and attentiveness in a fragmented world.
